

### **Interesting Facts:**


- In 1866, the first permanent communications link between Europe and America was established on Valentia Island.



### **Interesting Facts:**


- Achill Island is connected to the mainland by the Michael Davitt Bridge.

### **Interesting Facts:**


- Two islands make up the Saltee Islands, Great Saltee and Little Saltee



- The northern island, Inis Tuasiceart, is known as the sleeping giant from its appearance from the east. Can you spot the sleeping giant in the photo?


